To ensure that these determinations are made fairly and consistently, SSA has developed criteria for eligibility

and a process for assessing each claimant against the criteria. *Visual Impairments: Determining Eligibility for Social Security Benefits* examines SSA's methods of determining disability for people with visual impairments, recommends changes that could be made now to improve the process and the outcomes, and identifies research needed to develop improved methods for the future.
